This presentation will introduce Hillman Cancer Institute researchers to Pitt's University Center for Social & Urban Research (UCSUR), with a focus on survey research infrastructure, resources, and opportunities for collaboration. Dr. Beach, who has directed UCSUR's Survey Research Program (SRP) for 20 years, has conducted research on the psychosocial aspects of aging, family caregiving, and elder abuse. He will discuss recent UCSUR work in these areas with either direct or potential relevance to cancer patients and their caregivers. This includes a 2017 telephone survey of approximately 1,000 local family caregivers, 274 of whom reported the care recipient as having cancer. Recent work on family caregiver burden and care recipient unmet needs for care is also discussed.
